

INFORMATION OBLIGATION VIDEO-SURVEILLANCE OF THE EXHIBITION

As the provisions of **Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (OJ L No 119)**, hereinafter the ‘**GDPR**’, entered into force on 25 May 2018, we would like to notify you of the following:

1. The Controller of your personal data acquired via video-surveillance of the outdoor Exhibition “After the Great War” (‘**Exhibition**’), i.e. data revealing your image (‘**Personal Data**’), shall be the **public cultural institution Institute of the European Network Remembrance and Solidarity based in Warsaw** at Zielna 37 St., 00-108 Warsaw, Poland acting on the basis of an entry into the register of cultural institutions kept by the Minister of Culture, National Heritage and Sport of the Republic of Poland under the number of RIK 90/2015, holding the unique taxpayer’s NIP number 701-045-62-60 (hereinafter the ‘**Controller**’).

The video surveillance covers the area of the Exhibition and its closest surroundings (within up to 5 metres from the walls of the main pavilion and the smaller box).

Providing Personal Data is voluntary, but necessary in order to move around the premises described above. If you object to the recording of your image on the video, it is necessary to leave the premises covered by the video surveillance.

3. Your Personal Data shall be processed by the Controller pursuant to the GDPR – legitimate interests of the Controller, **for the purpose of ensuring safety of people visiting the Exhibition and the property of the Controller, including the Exhibition itself and its parts.**
4. Your Personal Data shall be processed on the basis of the following legal bases:
 - 1) pursuant to Article 6(1) (f) of the GDPR –processing is necessary for purposes arising from legitimate interests pursued by the Controller or by a third party –by which the safety of people (visitors etc.) and property is understood – Exhibition and its parts.
5. Your Personal Data may be received by the following categories of entities:
 - 1) entities authorized to receive your data on the basis of legal provisions, e.g. the police;
 - 2) providers of technical services (including, for instance, audio-visual services);
 - 3) coordinators of the Exhibition with whom the Controller concluded agreement(s);
 - 4) if necessary: entities providing advisory, consulting, auditing, legal assistance, security system servicing and other similar services to the Controller.
6. Your Personal Data will be processed for the period necessary to achieve the above-mentioned processing purposes, but not longer than 14 days. This period may be extended on the basis and within the limits of applicable law, including for the period necessary to conduct criminal, civil and administrative or similar proceedings.
7. You shall have the right to request from the Controller:
 - 1) access to your Personal Data,
 - 2) that your incorrect Personal Data be rectified without delay as well as to request (considering the purpose for which the data is processed) that incomplete Personal Data be completed,
 - 3) that your Personal Data be erased without delay and the Controller shall be obliged to erase such Personal Data without undue delay (subject to the exceptions provided for in Article 17(3) of the GDPR),
 - 4) that the processing of your Personal Data be restricted.

You shall also have the right to object to the processing of your Personal Data pursuant to Article 21 of the GDPR.

8. Pursuant to Article 77 of the GDPR, you shall have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection (Polish abbreviation: **PUODO**) or another body competent in the field of personal data protection to replace the PUODO, as well as another supervising authority, should you find that the processing of your Personal Data infringes on the provisions of the GDPR.
9. You shall not be subject to any decisions based solely on automated processing which produce legal effects concerning you or similarly significantly affect you.
